

# ENDNOTES

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- 227 One wonders whether Smith or one of his scribes accidentally spelled Amlici without a /k/. Regardless, Amlici appears in *The Book of Mormon* in Alma 2 and Alma 3 (95% SS and 86% SS, respectively). Amulek appears in Alma 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, 31, 34, 35 and Helaman 5. Some of these chapters appear to be heavily reworked, as they contain several sermons and anachronistic doctrinal tangents, which additions were probably inserted by Rigdon. Amaleki appears in Mosiah 7 (72% SS), 21 (73% SS), 22 (37% SS), 23 (83% SS), 24 (49% SS), and 27 (73% SS). Amalickiah appears in Alma 46 (60% SS), 47 (91% SS), 48 (75% SS), 49 (94% SS), 51 (86% SS), and 52 (84% SS). This cluster of similar-sounding names in the N text does not appear to be the invention of Rigdon or Smith; it is undoubtedly the invention of Spalding who used a very similar cluster in the F text.
- 228 Mosiah 2:3. Although the firstlings of flocks were sacrificed in Biblical times, they were never used as burnt offerings. The simplest explanation for this inaccuracy, of course, is that Spalding, Rigdon, or Smith made an inadvertent mistake.
